2a. Summary of Utah State Legislative Actions	<p>Sam Klemm, WFRC, updated the TAC on transportation related Utah State Legislative actions for 2007. Sam handed out a summary of the bills that were transportation related, and the outcome of each bill. Below is a brief summary. Contact Sam at sklemm@wfrc.org for a more detailed copy of the summary.</p> <p>House Bill (HB) 81 – Didn’t pass; HB 98 – Passed, but won’t affect the Ogden Layton Area; HB 108 – Passed, but won’t affect the Ogden Layton Area; HB 158 – Passed, the bill dealt with the \$10 vehicle registration fee; HB 166 – Didn’t pass, would have folded UTA into UDOT; HB 226 – Passed, but won’t affect the Ogden Layton Area; HB 266 – Didn’t pass; HB 282 – Combined with SB 223; HB 314 – Passed, the bill dealt with the auto-related sales tax and allows \$1 Billion bond for transportation; HB 383 – Passed, changed the 75/25 split for B&C funds to 70/30, but moved the 1/16 to the state; Senate Bill (SB) 12 – Didn’t pass, would have allowed \$500 Million for corridor preservation; SB 69 – Passed, requiring counties to list corridor preservation priorities; SB 223 – Passed, removed sales tax from food; SB 3 – Passed, funding to MPO’s.</p> <p>George Ramjoue, WFRC, handed out the Utah APA summary of planning bills of interest prepared by Wilf Summerkorn, Davis County.</p> <p>Please contact Sam Klemm at 363-4230 x116 for additional information.</p>	<p>None Required</p>

4. Bike and Pedestrian Map	<p>Jory Johner, WFRC, reviewed the proposed bicycle plan with the TAC members. 5. General Plan Updates	<p>George Ramjoue, WFRC, asked the TAC members for information on the status of city or county general plan updates or transportation studies. WFRC is interested in keeping the most up to date data base and requests that all cities and counties send updates or studies to its office. WFRC is also willing to provide assistance on updates and studies.</p> <p>South Weber noted that they were currently updating their general plan and will be studying the Highway 89 interchange. Centerville is updating the Westside of their general plan. Farmington is studying the North Legacy Connection and will also update their general plan. Woods Cross will be studying 500 South between I-15 and Legacy Parkway. West Point will be developing a new general plan.</p> <p>George asked that the cities and counties consider the Wasatch Choices 2040 document when updating their general plans. He has extra copies available if needed. Copies of the document can be down loaded from the www.wfrc.org web page.
