2. Long Range Plan Update	<p>Val Halford with WFRC provided copies of the Wasatch Front Urban Area Long Range Transportation Plan 2002-2030 Executive Summary. This summary provides a list of transit projects, highway projects, maps, and a synopsis of each of the chapters in the Long Range Plan.</p> <p>WFRC formed a Transit 2030 Committee which is compiling and analyzing recommendations to the current transit plan as well as the financial plan scheduled for approval and adoption by fall 2003.</p> <p>Initial open houses are scheduled for review and comment on the Long Range Plan Update:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. 3. STP & CM/AQ Programs	<p>Ben Wuthrich of WFRC, updated the Technical Advisory Committee on the TIP, and handed out the current CMAQ and STP program lists. Ben noted that the Letters of Intent for potential projects are due on November 22, 2002. The upcoming TIP will include adding projects to the program years of 2006, 2007, and 2008. Ben also told the group that any project that has been submitted in past years must be resubmitted, and Ben requested that in the Letter of Intent for the project it state if the project was submitted before. 4. Bicycle & Pedestrian Initiatives/ Statewide Long Range Plan	<p>Sandy Weinrauch of UDOT presented a summary of UDOT's approach to getting communities working together that are interested in pedestrian and bicycle trails. The key is getting the pedestrian and bicycle committee to work with elected officials, planners, engineers and various interest groups working on a common goal by coming to a consensus and coordinating projects.</p> <p>Connectivity of trails is an important area that UDOT is looking to improve. Connecting trails gives the maximum utilization of enhancement funds and also provides for more shared-use pathways.</p> <p>Sandy mentioned that the Utah Statewide Long Range Transportation Plan 20-year horizon is scheduled for approval by the end of the year 2003. As a part of that plan, public involvement is critical. UDOT is planning to tour the state to find out what the communities concerns and desires are with regards to trails. Sandy emphasized that UDOT is open to suggestions and would like feedback.</p> <p>The American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials Guide (AASHTO) and Statewide Pedestrian and Bicycle Plan have been adopted by the Transportation Commission. 5. Street Excavation Committee Report	<p>Ben Wuthrich gave an update on the study that was considered in Salt Lake County by the Street Excavation Committee. Instead of pursuing a study of determining fees for cut effects, the committee concluded to recommend each city should manage their own utility cuts in their roads using the new (APWA) Standards.</p>	None Required
