3. How does “Buy America” Affect You?	Rob White of UDOT distributed materials and delivered a presentation about the new federal “Buy America” requirements. This policy applies to all federal aid projects. Iron and steel used in these projects must be melted and manufactured in the U.S. Failure to comply with the “Buy America” provisions could result in jeopardizing all other federal funds for the project. The policy also applies to utilities in the project, but temporary elements, such as concrete forms, are exempt. For further details contact your UDOT project manager.	Information
4. UTA Network Study Overview	Layne Jones of Lochner Assoc. has been contracted to direct the study to identify the “next tier” of transit capital investments as UTA completes Frontlines 2015. FTA requires an “investment per rider” analysis for all fixed guideway projects. Two land use scenarios will be considered within the study. The study is scheduled to be completed by Oct 2012. 5. RTP 2015 & WC 2040	Val Halford of WFRC informed the committee that the Second Wasatch Choice for 2040 Consortium Meeting will be held from 9-noon on March 27 at the Salt Palace. Val distributed a number of materials related to this event. All are strongly encouraged to attend. The WC 2040 provides the socio-economic and land use background for the RTP.	Information
6. TIP Business	<p><u>Review STP/CMAQ Proposed Projects</u> – Ben Wuthrich of WFRC presented a slide show summarizing the costs, details, and a few photos of the STP projects submitted for consideration of federal funds for the 2018 year in the TIP as of January 26, 2012. A number of project submittals were lacking sufficient detail for proper evaluation. WFRC will work with project sponsors to notify them of missing information, but it is the sponsor’s responsibility to provide the information in the requested format within the agreed deadlines. A total of 35 STP projects were submitted with an estimated cost of \$146.9 M. There is an estimated \$21 M available in STP funds.</p> <p>Kip Billings of WFRC reviewed the list of projects that have been submitted for CMAQ funding in year 2018 of the TIP, with a slide show summarizing the cost, details, and a few photos of each project. A total of 20 CMAQ projects were submitted with an estimated cost of \$29.5 M. There is an estimated \$4 M available in CMAQ funds.</p> <p><u>Draft STP & CMAQ Process</u> – Ben reviewed with the committee the next steps for the STP and CMAQ projects and the draft 2013-2018 TIP process.
