1. Approval of 03/11/08 Meeting Summary	The March 11, 2008 meeting summary was approved with no changes.	Approved
2. Mid Valley Highway EIS Update	<p>Vern Loveless, Tooele County, updated the Committee on the Mid Valley Highway Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). Vern noted that the Purpose and Need have been completed for the Study. They are currently evaluating the impact on the natural and built environment. Vern also noted that the most western alternative (Sheep Lane) does not meet the Purpose and Need and may be dropped in the near future. The project is also currently updating the agriculture protection land inventory. Vern noted that all alternatives have access to and from the Mid Valley Highway at SR-138, SR-112/1000 North, and the newly proposed railroad corridor (south of Erda Way).</p> <p>Paul Hansen, Tooele City, noted that Tooele City does not favor the green or orange alignments south of SR-112. Those alternatives will have an impact on the Utah State University Satellite Campus.</p> <p>Dan Jones performed a citizen survey on Tooele County needs, and transportation and water were the top two needs identified.</p> <p>Vern said there will be an open house for the EIS this summer, and the Draft EIS should be complete by October. 3. SR-112 and SR-138 Mobility / Access Management Study Update	<p>Jory Johner, WFRC, updated the RPO on the SR-112 and SR-138 Mobility / Access Management Study. Hales Engineering has completed Draft Corridor Agreements. They have also made phone calls to set up meetings with the Planning Commissions, City Councils, Mayors and County Commissioners to review the study. The Corridor Agreements include suggested access points along SR-112 and SR-138. WFRC and UDOT requested to also be invited to the city and county meetings. 4. Functional Classification Review	<p>Peter Jager, UDOT, said that a full adjustment of the Functional Classification System is reviewed after each Census, and updated about halfway between Censuses. Peter handed out Tooele City and Grantsville City Functional Classification maps, and a Tooele County map. Vern requested a zoomed in Functional Classification map of the Tooele Valley. Suggested new facilities included the Railroad corridor, Mid Valley Highway, and to extend 1000 North to SR-112. Peter noted other recommendations during the meeting and requested the cities and county review the maps and submit comments to him by May 30th.</p> <p>Please contact Peter Jager at 801-965-4560 for additional information.</p>	None Required
5. East-West Traffic Issues	<p>Vern Loveless, Tooele County, updated the RPO on the SR-138 and Airport issues. He said that the main issue was the 50:1 Runway Protection Zone (RPZ). He noted the ground easement for the new instrumentation. Jory Johner, WFRC, noted the planned road to the east of the runways that will tie into SR-138. Vern pointed out the planned bulb out on SR-138 to avoid the RPZ. He handed out a copy of these plans.</p> <p>The Railroad Corridor is planned to cross Tooele County between SR-36 (about 0.5 to 1.0 mile south of Erda Way) and connect to SR-112 (just east of Grantsville City). Vern handed out an 11" x 17" corridor plan for the Railroad Corridor and a detailed</p>	None Required

	connection to SR-36 south of Cimmarron Way. The corridor is planned to be 200 ft. of right-of-way (ROW) and include trails and transit along with the roadway. Vern discussed the property acquisition potentially needed to connect to SR-36 and SR-112. Please contact Vern Loveless at 435-843-3160 for additional information.
